

WELCOME NEW STUDENTS!



UNIVERSITY LIGHT IS STILL YELLOW: WHAT THIS MEANS FOR FSS

MU is operating following the university traffic-light system. The risk assessment level is currently YELLOW.

- MU buildings are closed to the public (with few exceptions).
- Classes are limited to a maximum of 200 people at FSS, facemasks should be worn in classes.
- People with symptoms of infectious viral infections are prohibited from entering MU buildings.
- Students and employees are obliged to inform MU about their return from a foreign country.
- MU asks <u>students</u> and <u>employees</u> to fill in information about their vaccination status.

Foreigners entering the country should see instruction for <u>students</u> and <u>employees</u>. See also current <u>restrictions</u> in the Czech Republic.



THE MUNICIPAL WASTE FEE IN BRNO IN 2022

INFORMATION FOR FOREIGN NATIONALS

Since 1/1/2013 the local fees for municipal waste in Brno have had to be paid for by:

- all foreign nationals (both EU and non-EU) residing in Brno for longer than 3 months (until 2012 it was only those with a permanent residence permit). The fee is to be paid for by each person.
- all owners of property (flats or family houses) in which no person is registered as staying. For example if you own two flats, and you are registered as resident in one of them, and if in the other flat no-one is registered as resident, you are liable to pay once for yourself as a result of your residence and a second time due to your ownership of property in which no-one is registered as resident.

The above mentioned fee payers are obliged to:

- 1) pay for the fee in due time (if the fee is not paid for in due time, it may be increased up to three times the fee)
- 2) to report this fact to the fee administrator (electronic forms are available at www.brno.cz/odpady); failing the reporting duty may result in a fine imposed by the fee administrator. In the administration of tax all meetings are to be conducted and all documents are to be produced in Czech.

FEE RATE 670 CZK per payer for the calendar year 2022 - FEE TO BE PAID BY 31/5/2022 You can make the payment from January already.

Concerning a duty to pay the fee arising in the period from 1/5 to 31/12, a proportionate part of the fee is payable by the last day of the month following the month in which the duty to pay the fee arose. ACCOUNT NUMBER

111220022/0800 (Česká spořitelna, a.s.), the payment reference number ("variabilní symbol") is the personal identification number of the fee payer.

Vaccination - how to get it

If you haven't already been vaccinated against Covid-19 you now have numerous options as a self payer (if you have European Health Insurance or Czech Pubic health insurance, you should also follow the information on how to <u>register</u> for the vaccine without paying).

The last vaccination at MU facilities will take place on Friday, 11 February, at the Faculty of Arts, from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. in room D22

Vaccination - how to pay for it

FSS students should first try to be reimbursed by their health insurance company. Foreigners.cz has written an <u>article</u> about the process to do so for the different insurance companies.

If your insurance company doesn't reimburse you, you can request reimbursement from FSS. In order to do so, you must have completed both doses of the vaccine (or in the case of Johnson and Johnson just the 1 dose) and have the proof of payment, or that it was only for the booster shot. Please email Klára Němečková at 217236@mail.muni.cz to set up a time to meet with her to fill out the paperwork for reimbursement.

This policy will continue through the spring 2022 semester to prove our students more time to get vaccinated and obtain the booster doses.

Vaccination recognition

Please use this <u>link</u> to find out if the vaccination certificate from your country is recognized in the Czech Republic Only certificated from countries on the list are recognized here and only vaccination by vaccine authorised by the European Medicines Agency (Vaxzevria/AstraZeneca; Spikevax/Moderna; Comirnaty/Pfizer; Janssen) or a vaccine manufactured in accordance with a patent for the above vaccines that is approved by the World Health Organization for emergency use (the Covishield vaccine) are recognized.

If you are vaccinated by other vaccine or if your certificate is from a country which is not on the list, you are considered as unvaccinated by the Czech government. This means that all current rules apply to you, so you have to stay in 5 days self-isolation after travelling from red/dark-red country and get the PCR test after these 5 days.

REPORTING POSITIVE TEST RESULTS

Informing MUNI of positive coronavirus results

Anyone who tests positive for coronavirus will be contacted by the Hygienic Department with the phone number you provided. Please do not change phone numbers if you are waiting for results.

If students test positive for Coronavirus they must do the following.

- 1. Report your positive test in IS System.
- 2. Contact your study department and the IRO office at FSS that you have tested positive.

If you live in the university dormitories, the dormitories will be alerted by the FSS IRO office that you have tested positive and they will contact you if new arrangements need to be made.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Regulations by Government for the country

- Facemasks (N95) are required inside all public buildings and in public transportation
- PCR tests are now valid for 3 days, and antigen tests for 24 hours.

ENTRY TO THE CZECH REPUBLIC

all students should check the current restrictions before traveling

Entry requirements are based on your residency status with the Czech Republic (visa, resident permit, etc.), the country you are travelling from and if you are vaccinated with a recognized vaccine and if the country you were vaccinated is on the <u>list</u>. It is up to each student to determine what procedure they must follow, as it is different in every case. To review the requirements you can visit the MU <u>website</u>.

Students who are required to receive a negative covid test will need to continue to wear a respirator in dormitories and all public places until their negative covid test. This is the case for students travelling from all locations except 'black countries' these countries have a stricter testing requirement and isolation is required. To stay up to date with what color your departure country falls under, please use the MU <u>website</u> and always check the Ministry <u>website</u>.
