

THESIS DEFENSE AND FINAL STATE EXAMS

Don't forget any steps.

As the end of the semester nears, it is important to know the different requirements for your specific programme regarding when a final version of your thesis is due, when you must register for your state exam, and when you must sign up for your thesis defense.

Dates are different for every programme, therefore it is crucial for you to reach out to your programme guarantor or department secretary to make sure you don't miss anything!

FINAL EXAMS

Make sure you register

For most programmes, multiple dates are provided to sit for final exams. As such, it is necessary to register for your final exams. Please make sure you know the examination method for your courses.

Additionally, it is important to remember to cancel your registration PRIOR to the exam date if you wish to take the exam at a different time. Failure to sit for your exam at the time you registered for may result in a failure. While you will have the option to take the exam again (provided there are additional dates available), both grades may show up (depending on your programme).

SPRING 2021

Online

The university leadership announced on Thursday, January 7 that the Spring semester will be held online. Teaching will take place between March 1-May 30. The exam period will last until mid-July, however the faculties are able to extend this period, if they decide to do so.

This decision was made as the coronavirus pandemic continues to impact the Czech Republic, and so both students and staff can have enough time to effectively plan for their next semester.

COURSE REGISTRATION

Starts January 18

Course registration for Spring 2021 is open from January 18-31.

Course enrolment will last from February 1-28.


Study or Work Abroad

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

State of Emergency extended to Jan. 22 (may be extended)

The Czech Government has created a <u>Covid Portal</u> in English that we encourage students to look at and us.

In November, an <u>anti-epidemic system PES</u> was created to access the risk level of the country, and determine if regulations would be relaxed or implemented. REPORTING POSITIVE TEST RESULTS

Informing MUNI of positive coronavirus results

Anyone who tests positive for coronavirus will be contacted by the Hygienic Department with the phone number you provided. Please do not change phone numbers if you are waiting for results.

If students test positive for Coronavirus they must do the following.

- 1. Report your positive test in IS System.
- 2. Contact your study department and the IRO office at FSS that you have tested positive.

If you live in the university dormitories, the dormitories will be alerted by the FSS IRO office that you have tested positive and they will contact you if new arrangements need to be made.
