St. Wenceslas Day (Czech Statehood Day)

On 28 September the country celebrates Czech Statehood day. St. Wenceslas is the patron saint of Bohemia and this day is considered Czech Statehood Day.

You will find that almost every restaurant will offer roasted goose with red cabbage and potato dumplings, the traditional meal for this day.

Stores larger than 200m2 are required to be closed on this day.

ISIC CARDS

Renewing and purchasing

Returning students MUST renew their ISIC cards by purhasing a new sticker for their card. Without a revalidation sticker to 12/2022, the ISIC school card is invalid for the upcoming year! Students can purchase the sticker for FSS in the <u>IS system, it is called "Revalidační přelepka ISIC"</u>. It costs 180CZK.

New students will take their photo during orientation week, however they would have needed to purchase the ISIC card for 180CZK, it is called "<u>Průkaz ISIC – první průkaz (prezenční</u> studium) na Fakultě sociálních studií"



LANGUAGE AND SPORTS CLASSES

Open to FSS Full degree and exchange students

Students can enrol in the Physical Education courses offered by University Sports Centre and take classes such as Zumba, Table Tennis, Football, etc. To see the full list of courses, visit the FSpS website.

Full degree students are also able to enrol in free French and Spanish introductory language courses taught in English. Other <u>language courses</u> are offered at the Language Centre in Italian, Chinese, Swahili, German, and Czech, however there is a fee for these courses.

PRIOR DEGREE RECOGNITION

Required for all NEW Full Degree Students

According to Czech law, all full degree students must have their prior degrees recognized in order to study in a degree program in the Czech Republic. FSS students can submit this recognition to Klára when they arrive, however they should be sure to have all the necessary paperwork with them from their home country.

REMINDER: ENROLL AND REGISTER FOR THE SEMESTER AND COURSES

Course enrollment is from 1.9 to 12.09 and changes to your courses can take place between 13-26 September.

Quick Reminder - Registration and Enrollment are separate actions

- Registration: The registration period determines the interest of students in courses. Students can obtain better time stamps for capacity-limited courses.
- Enrollment: During this period there is an automatic enrollment / confirmation of subjects for which enrollment conditions have been met (capacity, prerequisites, etc.). Only at the moment of enrollment do you acquire the right and obligation to study the course.

TEACHING AT FSS

Fall 2021 - in person, online an option for some

The semester will start on 13 September with in person teaching. All students are expected to follow the guidelines set out and attend classes in person. Exceptions will be made only for international students who are unable to travel to Brno due to visa restrictions. Accommodations will be set up for these students, and teachers will communicate with students directly how the teaching will take place. Please keep in mind that these exceptions will only be in effect until 31 October as long as the pandemic situation stays as it is. If it worsens, the Faculty will take this into account.

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE

Regulations by Government and University

Governmental Regulations

- Facemasks (N95) are required inside all public buildings and in public transportation
- Recognized vaccination OR a negative test (within 72 hours for anti-gen or 7 days for PCR) is required to eat at restaurants, swim in pools, etc. Cultural and social events may require proof of vaccination or a negative test.

University and FSS Regulations

- Students staying in the accommodation are required to provide proof of vaccination or a negative covid test before entering. Students are sent this information from the accommodation services with information on how to upload it into the IS.
- Currently, the university is at a 'white' risk rating. The university will monitor this closely and change it as needed. To better understand the different rankings, please visit the university website.

ENTRY TO THE CZECH REPUBLIC

all students should check the current restrictions before traveling

Entry requirements are based on the current ranking of countries you have spent time in, and if you are vaccinated with a recognized vaccine. It is up to each student to determine what procedure they must follow, as it is different in every case. Masaryk University has created a helpful 'app' to help walk through the current restrictions and what steps must be taken. To understand if you need to be tested, self isolate, etc., you can use this <u>flow chart</u>.

Limited Movement: Students who are required to receive a negative covid test will need to observe a ban of free movement until their negative covid test. This means that you can only go to get groceries and other necessities, go to the bank, post office, the doctor's and pharmacies, deal with inevitable administrative tasks (like the foreign police/OAMP registration) and travel to your place of stay.

Vaccination - how to get it

If you haven't already been vaccinated against Covid-19 you now have numerous options as a self payer (if you have European Health Insurance or Czech Pubic health insurance, you should also follow the information on how to <u>register</u> for the vaccine without paying).

It is possible to continue through the Governmental registration system, however to make the process even easier a number of walk-in vaccination centres have opened up around the country. In Brno, two locations are at the Olympia Shopping Centre and Janacek Theater. It is also possible to receive the Johnson and Johnson vaccination at Olympia, the one shot vaccination, which may be particularly helpful for our students who still wish to travel home this summer and would like to not have to quarantine upon return. (It is important to remember that students living in the dorms must quarantine at the special area and pay nightly for this).

Both individuals with access to the public health insurance, and self payers can take advantage of these vaccination centres. Payment for the vaccine can only be done with a card.

Vaccination - how to pay for it

FSS students should first try to be reimbursed by their health insurance company. Foreigners.cz has written an <u>article</u> about the process to do so for the different insurance companies.

If your insurance company doesn't reimburse you, you can request reimbursement from FSS. In order to do so, you must have completed both doses of the vaccine (or in the case of Johnson and Johnson just the 1 dose) and have the proof of payment. Please email Klára Němečková at 217236@mail.muni.cz to set up a time to meet with her to fill out the paperwork for reimbursement.

This policy will continue through the fall 2021 semester to prove our students more time to get vaccinated.

Quick note on the vaccination

At the moment the Czech Republic, like much of Europe, is highly relying on the vaccination (or negative tests) to participate in every day life. At the same time, the Czech Republic is only recognizing vaccinations approved by the EMA, or similar agencies. The government may change this opinion, but it is not guarantied.

If students are in Brno, we strongly encourage them to receive their vaccination here to make their experience in Brno easier.
