EASTER TRADITIONS

15-18 April

The Czech Republic has some pretty unique traditions typically, Easter weekend starts with Zelený čtvrtek (Green Thursday) with the monuments lit up green...and green beer is on tap. For those of you who are familiar with Christian holidays, Good Friday, White Saturday and Easter Sunday are for Christians the most important holidays.

However, Easter Monday is one of the more unique aspects of Czech (and Slovak) culture. This time of year you would see pomlázka (whips) sold throughout the city. Feelings on this tradition are very mixed, as it originated during pagan times when boys would whip girls lightly on the legs to chase away illness, bad spirits and to bring about health and youth for the next year. This tradition is still kept in villages around the country, though fewer people believe the tradition should remain. Although some boys and men strive to keep the skills of creating the pomlázka - maybe the whipping part can be left behind.:)

RENEWING VISAS AND WORK VISAS

Be aware of the expiration date

Students are responsible with ensuring their residency in the Czech Republic stays active. We urge students to look at their visa or residence permit expiration dates and plan ahead.

Students should schedule their appointment in the governmental system https://frs.gov.cz/en . Often appointments are booked 1-2 months in advance and it can be hard to get last minute appointments, therefore please plan ahead!

Once an appointment is scheduled, students can use our new FSS Mates programme to attend the appointment and help with any translation problems.

In the current situation the faculty is not able to call and get you an appointment - we do not have this power.

Renewing your student visa/residence permit

As a reminder, you cannot submit the application to renew your study visa until 120 days before the expiration date (i.e. if it is for September 4, you earliest you can apply is May 4), however it is always good to review what you will need for the application (proof of funds, health insurance, etc.) so you can plan ahead. Please don't forget that according to the governmental decision you are allowed to use only PVZP company and it must be comprehensive health care. Other insurance won't be accepted by the MOI office for visa purposes, you can use this <u>link</u> to get the insurance.

- For information about applying for a Long Term Residence Permit for the first time, please go to the MOI website here. It's necessary to submit the application personally.

Renewing your student visa/residence permit

Students who are renewing a residence permit (the plastic card) are able to submit the <u>documents</u> via registered mail (in Czech "doporučeně")- during these times we urge you to use this option. Please send them also "žádost o sdělení čísla jednacího" (to get your application number) and don´t forget you need to send also the stamp to pay it (in Czech "kolek", you can buy it at the post office). If you have questions about this process, you can write to Klára Němečková at 217236@muni.cz and she will help advise you.

Are you graduating? 'Purpose of seeking employment' visas allows you to stay in the Czech Republic for up to 9 months to find a job and transition to a work visa.

Foreign nationals who are residing in the territory of the Czech Republic with a long-term residence permit for the purpose of studies and who successfully completed their university education are eligible to file an application for a long-term residence permit for the purpose of seeking employment or, as the case may be, an application for a long-term residence permit for the purpose of starting a business. For more information on the requirements for obtaining a visa for the 'purposes of seeking employment', please visit the MOI website.

FSS MATES

support for international students

The Faculty of Social Studies has created a support system for students when they have appointments at governmental offices or doctors to provide translation services.

Please note, the FSS Mate is not responsible to make an appointment for students, nor to help students fill out applications (i.e. it is the students responsibility that they have all the required documentations required of the appointment).

Entry to the Czech Republic

- All people entering the Czech Republic, regardless of the destination country, will need to submit an <u>arrival form</u> for the country.
- The arrival from a foreign country is to be entered in the <u>IS</u> system in the case of students or <u>INET</u> in the case of employees respectively. To stay up to date with what color your departure country falls under, please use the MU <u>website</u> and always check the Ministry <u>website</u>

Regulations by the University and Government

- The University ill move to the 'white' risk rating. For more about what this means, please visit the university website.
- Respirators (N95, FFP2) are compulsory on public transport, and in health and social services.
- PCR tests are now valid for 3 days, and antigen tests for 24 hours.

Reporting Positive Test Results

If students test positive for Coronavirus they must do the following.

- Report your positive test in IS System.
- Contact your study department and the IRO office at FSS that you have tested positive.
