Please note, the FSS Mate is not responsible to make an appointment for students, nor to help students fill out applications (i.e. it is the students responsibility that they have all the required documentations required of the appointment).

COVID TRAFFIC LIGHT CHANGES WHITE

Starting Monday, 7 March

The university will follow the current government measures:

- Respirators or surgical masks are obligatory in common areas of MU buildings or when switching between classes.
- Respirators are not required in classes where students only sit and do not interact

RENEWING VISAS AND WORK VISAS

Be aware of the expiration

Students are responsible with ensuring their residency in the Czech Republic stays active. We urge students to look at their visa or residence permit expiration dates and plan ahead. At the moment is not possible to schedule an appointment, and if students need a new residence permit now and must apply in person they should go and wait for drop in appointments (arrive before opening hours).

Even in this complicated situation, it is still necessary to submit an application before your current visa/resident permit expire.

However students should check the system https://frs.gov.cz/en to see if this changes. Once appointments do open, we can expect appointments will be booked for 2-3 months in advance and it can be hard to get last minute appointments. Once an appointment is scheduled, students can use our new FSS Mates programme to attend the appointment and help with any translation problems.

In the current situation the faculty is not able to call and get you an appointment - we do not have this power.

Renewing your student visa/residence permit

As a reminder, you cannot submit the application to renew your study visa until 120 days before the expiration date (i.e. if it is for September 4, you earliest you can apply is May 4), however it is always good to review what you will need for the application (proof of funds, health insurance, etc.) so you can plan ahead.

Renewing your student visa/residence permit

Students who are renewing a residence permit (the plastic card) are able to submit the <u>documents</u> via registered mail (in Czech "doporučeně")- during these times we urge you to use this option. Please send them also "žádost o sdělení čísla jednacího" (to get your application number) and don't forget you need to send also the stamp to pay it (in Czech "kolek", you can buy it at the post office). If you have questions about this process, you can write to Klára Němečková at 217236@muni.cz and she will help advise you.

Are you graduating? 'Purpose of seeking employment' visas allows you to stay in the Czech Republic for up to 9 months to find a job and transition to a work visa.

Foreign nationals who are residing in the territory of the Czech Republic with a long-term residence permit for the purpose of studies and who successfully completed their university education are eligible to file an application for a long-term residence permit for the purpose of seeking employment or, as the case may be, an application for a long-term residence permit for the purpose of starting a business. 

Ester Krumbachová Exhibition

Ester Krumbachová (1923–1996) worked as a theater artist from 1953 - first in České Budějovice, later in Prague. She has participated in many significant Czech New Wave films. The exhibition is an extensive network of original material , texts, paintings and artifacts connected to Krumbachova . It primarily represents Ester Krumbachova's archiveas, revealing her thinking about costume design, the role of detail and the use of color, working with text speech and folklore rather than high literary style, its relationship to magic, realism , subjectivity, male and female polarity or hierarchy of species as well as social and work positions. REPORTING POSITIVE TEST RESULTS

Informing MUNI of positive coronavirus results

If students test positive for Coronavirus they must do the following.

- 1. Report your positive test in <u>IS System</u>.
- 2. Contact your study department and the IRO office at FSS that you have tested positive.

ENTRY TO THE CZECH REPUBLIC

all students should check the current restrictions before traveling

Entry requirements are based on your residency status with the Czech Republic (visa, resident permit, etc.), the country you are travelling from and if you are vaccinated with a recognized vaccine and if the country you were vaccinated is on the <u>list</u>. It is up to each student to determine what procedure they must follow, as it is different in every case. To review the requirements you can visit the MU <u>website</u>.

Students who are required to receive a negative covid test will need to continue to wear a respirator in dormitories and all public places until their negative covid test. To stay up to date with what color your departure country falls under, please use the MU <u>website</u> and always check the Ministry <u>website</u> and <u>this step by step guide</u>.
